A famous quote that defines who I am is "If you have no confidence in self, you are twice defeated in the race of life. With confidence you have won even before you have started." This quote belongs to Marcus Garvey, a Jamaican political activist of the mid twentieth century. Two of his notable achievements were sparking a mass Black nationalist movement and founding the Universal Negro Improvement Association, or UNIA, which focused on the betterment of Africa. This quote originated from *The Philosophy and Opinions of Marcus Garvey, Or Africa for the Africans*, a book the activist published in 1923 that consists of a compilation of Garvey's speeches and articles of the time.

This quote means if you give up before you try, you have already lost. On the contrary, if you do have confidence in yourself, you have won by giving yourself a chance. This reflects my life and academic goals because I have had low self-confidence in the past and I am trying to work on that in the future.

One reason this quote embodies my academic goals is because I resonate with having low self-confidence. I have often been told I excel in academics, and hearing this made me afraid to try to participate in other aspects of life.
